

# CancerCon Call for Speakers FAQ

## Where can I apply?

### What should I include in my submission?

#### When are submissions due?

All submissions for CancerCon 2022 are due by February 16, 2022.

#### Who can submit?

Anyone is welcome to submit, but Stupid Cancer is looking for mostly professional experts and speakers to share their expertise in issues relevant to the AYA cancer community. Speakers should be able to conduct open, interactive, and age-appropriate sessions tailored to the unique and unmet needs of our specific AYA population.

If you are a patient or survivor community member with an idea for a breakout session, you are welcome to submit a proposal and request to be paired with a professional to develop the session.

# I am a survivor/patient/caregiver looking to share my story. Is submitting to Call for Speakers the right thing for me?

The goal of our breakout sessions is to provide attendees with psychosocial support, educational materials, and practical tools to bring into their everyday lives. We love to share the stories of our community members, and there are opportunities to do so as an attendee of CancerCon, but this Call for Speakers is not the appropriate venue for survivors and caregivers looking to share their story.

However, experienced public speakers with a proven track record of addressing large audiences are welcome to submit a proposal for a General Session Keynote presentation. A sample video of the speaker presenting the content or story is required for consideration (footage from prior speaking events or self-recorded footage are both accepted).

# What kinds of topics are you looking for?

Stupid Cancer is looking for submissions that address our attendees' needs and crucial topics in AYA cancer. Recurring core topics are mental health, sex, relationships, fertility, career, and advocacy.

We prioritize sessions that are tailored to specific audience groups. Examples include:

- Patients: Newly Diagnosed & In Treatment
- Survivors: Post Treatment
- Survivors: Chronic/Metastatic
- Caregivers
- Non-Profit Professionals
- Health Professionals

### I'd like to submit a disease-specific session. Are those accepted?

While we occasionally offer sponsored disease-specific pre-conference panels, we are not looking for disease-specific breakout sessions.

### How are speakers chosen?

Submissions will be reviewed by a selection committee comprised of Stupid Cancer staff, patient and professional community members, and industry professionals. Proposals will be chosen based on the following criteria:

- qualifications and expertise of speakers
- priority and relevance of session topic
- quality of proposal and session design
- fitting into the overall needs of the conference agenda

# I would like to submit a panel but I do not know all of the people who will be joining me yet. Can I still submit my session?

Yes. While we prefer to know all of the speakers participating in a session, you can still submit without confirmed panelists. If you are a patient/survivor with a session idea that would like to be paired with a professional, please indicate that in your proposal.

If there are additional panelists that you plan to invite, please outline the credentials/experience of your desired speakers. DO NOT include information for any panelists or co-presenters that have not confirmed their participation.

There must be at least one confirmed speaker for all submissions.

# When will I find out if I have been accepted to speak?

All submissions for CancerCon Live 2022 will receive notification, regardless of status, in March 2022.

# Do you cover travel or hotel accommodations for speakers?

Stupid Cancer is a small nonprofit with a limited budget. While we are able to offer a modest honorarium to selected speakers, we are unfortunately not able to provide travel or hotel accommodations. Speakers are able to book rooms at the conference hotel, the Hyatt Regency Minneapolis, at our group rate of \$189.
